

Fiducia Supplicans - Pope Francis' letter on Blessings

Just weeks before Christmas, Pope Francis published a declaration on the pastoral meaning of blessings. In it, for the first time, Pope Francis said that same sex couples could approach their priest and ask for a blessing to help and sustain them on their journey of faith. This is not a blessing of their relationship, but them asking God to help them in their daily lives. For centuries the Church has blessed so many things; from our homes and our cars, to our pets, to guns and even nuclear weapons. Yet the same Church that blessed guns and nuclear weapons, refused to give any blessing to a person that identified as LGBTQ+. Pope Francis' pastoral care of every person is central to his papacy and this has been central from the beginning. This document, for the first time, shows how he has extended the love of Christ to everyone, as it should be. At the end of the document, Pope Francis writes, "every sister and brother will be able to feel that, in the Church, they are always pilgrims, always beggars, always loved, and despite everything, always blessed". What a beautiful thing to read and hear; Jesus loves everyone...without exception.
