Year of Prayer

This year has been set aside by Pope Francis as a year of prayer in preparation for the Holy Year next year. We are encouraged to think about how we pray and to spend some extra time in prayer if possible. There are as many ways to pray as there are people in our world; many have deep seated roots in our Church history. Lectio Divina, using a piece of Scripture and reflecting upon it over a period of time, is one of the older methods of prayer the church has. Throughout Lent, there is an opportunity for us to look at this as a parish (poster to follow). Also, beginning in Lent, we will have the opportunity to spend some time with our Lord in Exposition before each Mass, and there will be a day of reflection offered during Lent on 'The Prodigal Son'. More information will follow shortly.

Prayer is vital for us to develop our relationship with God, just as having a coffee or a pint helps our relationships with our friends... God waits for us to spend time with him and everyone is welcome as he loves each one of us unconditionally.
