Lent and the Year of Prayer Lent this year is so early, with Easter being as early as it possibly can be. During Lent, we are traditionally asked to examine three areas of our lives; to look at fasting, to spend time in prayer and reflect on the areas of our lives that we need God's grace to grow and to give any money that we may save through our fasting to those who are less fortunate than ourselves (Lenten Alms). These three aspects of Lent have served many for centuries, yet there are many who find some areas less helpful and sometimes even a barrier to developing their spiritual lives. I encourage each person to engage in those things that help them to grow spiritually and to take up other things to help with this growth. I would like to encourage everyone to spend some time in prayer each day; there are as many ways of praying as there are people in our world; when it comes to personal prayer I encourage you to use whatever works for you. I would also like to encourage each of us to spend some time each week with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. There will be Exposition before every					
Mass during Lent. This will be for 30 minutes each day that there is Mass, with the Saturday evening Exposition remaining at an hour with confessions					
offered at the same time. Next Sunday dates and information will be provided for the Days of Reflection on 'The Prodigal Son' as well as the Lectio Divina sessions will be held and where. Please do watch out for these and sign up for them if you are able to.

This lady had been praying for me each day for over 3 years. I was so touched that I was left speechless (now that doesn't happen very often). I know that she has continued to pray for me everyday since and it still moves me deeply. Prayer is a powerful gift that we can give to others, even when they don't know we are praying for them. On Sunday next week, 18th February, from 1pm—2pm we will have Exposition and Benediction, with prayers especially for all vocations, with a specific prayer for those who are currently in formation for priesthood. with Benediction.
