## COMMUNITY SUPPORT - FOOD COOP Dear Supporters,

This week 53 families and 38 single people have chosen and collected food from the Food Co-op (136 adults and 102 children). Donations were received from several local churches, a primary school, Gateshead Food bank, individual supporters and two other places that offer food who had a small surplus. All these donations were gratefully received. As usual, the tea, coffee and soup area were very busy. Additional refreshments were kindly given by a choir who had had a 'cake and chorus' evening. The cake was a real treat. Three donations of quantities of bread were a bonus enabling us to supply all members with a loaf or pack of bread buns.

This week the Migrant Health Nurse from the QE and the nurse from Second Street visited over the course of the morning. Both are proactive in helping members and engaging with them when they attend. They are a most welcome addition to our Tuesday morning session.

We intend to distribute Easter treats on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March and are grateful that we are starting to receive chocolate eggs and oil for our members. On **April 2<sup>nd</sup>** there will be no Food Co-op due to Easter week but will be open again on the 9<sup>th</sup> April.

#### On 13 March 2024 we served -

30 portions of scrambled egg, 68 chicken casseroles, 84 toasties, 24 helpings of cake and custard and 20 fruit crumbles

## We used -

3 tins of corned beef, 8 boxes of instant mash, 12 loaves of bread, 5kg chicken, 1 box of gravy mix, 2 tins of baked beans, 6 packets of casserole veg, 6 tins of carrots, 6 tins of peas, 4 tins of ham, 3 tins of tuna, 60 eggs, 50 cheese slices, 15 tins/packets of custard, 2 packets of crumble mix, 6 tins of fruit, 4 cakes, plus oranges, bananas, butter and salad

## **Stations of the Cross**

When I was at Seminary Stations of the Cross was held once during the Lenten Season on an evening, after which we had a festive meal.

I would like to have Stations of the Cross for each parish
St. Peter's on Thursday 21st March at 7.15pm
Corpus Christ on Wednesday 27th March at 7.15pm
This is an opportunity for us to gather and pray these significant points leading to Jesus to his death and burial.

I will be using a version of the Stations of the Cross that many may not have seen before. It is called, 'Bread Broken'.

They are beautifully written and illustrated.

Unlike most Stations of the Cross, we will remain in our seats as I will not only have the images around the Church but will also have copies in a small booklet for those who come along.

Throughout the service we will have short opportunities for silence and personal prayer.



Exposition before each Mass continues as we progress through Lent. It is good to see so many taking up the opportunity to spend time with the Lord in this way.

It is also moving to see how prayerful the Church is before Mass. This is something that quite a few people have commented on and I feel it is important to pass that on.

It is so good to see so many people coming into the Church as quietly as possible. I encourage us all to be ever mindful, whilst Exposition continues before Mass, to keep this in mind.

Lent is only 6 weeks long, and we are already over half way through.
