# Easter Triduum

This week we will mark the most important days in the Liturgical Year. We begin today with Palm Sunday, remembering Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where the people welcomed him shouting 'Hosanna'. Then, beginning on Maundy Thursday, we remember how this same group of people turned on Jesus and were soon heard shouting 'Crucify Him, Crucify Him'. The Easter Triduum is one service, beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday evening and finishing with the Easter Vigil on Easter Saturday evening. We begin Mass on Thursday evening in the traditional way, with the Sign of the Cross however there is no formal end to the Mass, as we then move into spending time 'watching with Our Lord' and where we leave in silence.

The Good Friday Service begins in silence and we are asked to remain silent from the moment we enter the church; when the procession at the beginning enters we do so in silence and the priest and deacon then prostrate before the altar. At the end of the service, we are again asked to leave in silence to remember and mark the significance of the day.

The Easter Vigil begins outside with the blessing of the fire, before the procession is lead into the Church by the Paschal Candle, the sign of Christ Risen from the Dead.

Please can we be extra vigilant during the Triduum to mark the silence and reverence as this helps all of us to remain attentive to others. Thank you in advance

When I was at Seminary Stations of the Cross was held once during the Lenten Season on an evening, after which we had a festive meal.


### Corpus Christ on Wednesday 27th March at 7.15pm
