It was encouraging to see them after so long and to hear how well they had settled in the Northeast.

Donations were received from several local churches, a primary school, individual supporters and the Saltwell Park Run. Many thanks for all these generous donations and thanks to all who deliver

them in time for the Tuesday session. With the numbers remaining high, certain stock items are quite depleted. These include dried pasta, dried spaghetti, pasta sauce,

tinned tomatoes, chickpeas and rice pudding.

Joe's Place

At Joe's Place this week the menu was; Scrambled eggs on toast, mince and dumplings with potatoes, peas, carrots and Yorkshirepuddings, toasties with a variety of fillings, apple crumble and cake with custard. We served 40 scrambled eggs, 85 mince and dumplings, 112 toasties, 82 desserts . We used 80 eggs, 14 loaves of bread, 21 tins of mince, 8 packets of dumpling mix, 18 tins of

potatoes, 18 tins of peas and carrots, 4 tins of ham, 4 tins of corned beef, 68 cheese slices, 15 tins of custard, 1 pack of frozen apples, 3 packets of crumble mix, 6 cakes, plus butter, milk, salad, oranges and bananas.

We are always grateful for donations especially of tins of mince and stewed steak, corned beef, ham, potatoes, peas and carrots. Cakes and custard are also appreciated. Please leave donations in the church porch or in the box provided
