At Joe's Place this week the menu was; scrambled eggs on toast, stewed steak with pie crust, potatoes, peas & carrots, toasties with a variety of fillings, pineapple crumble, cake & custard.

We served 34 scrambled eggs on toast, 79 stewed steak dinners, 110 toasties & 58 desserts.

We used 20 tins of stewed steak, 21 tins of potatoes, 12 tins of carrots, 12 tins of peas, 6 boxes of ready roll pastry, 14 loaves of bread, 6 tins of pineapples, crumble mix, 17 tins of custard, 60 eggs, 3 tins of ham, 3 tins of corned beef, 3 tins of tuna, 50 cheese slices plus salad, butter & milk.

We are always grateful for donations of tins of ham, corned beef, tuna, peas, carrots, tinned potatoes, cakes, tins/packets of instant custard.
