This week 59 families/couples and 49 single people attended the Food Co-op (162 adults and 102 children). It was a busy session, with a steady flow of people from when we opened at 10.45 until we closed. Donations were received from several local churches, a primary school, and individual supporters. All donations were gratefully received.

Many thanks to those who donated items that were particularly requested last week. With the numbers remaining steady, staples such as tinned tomatoes, chickpeas, kidney beans, pasta, long-life milk and dried spaghetti are always very welcome.~

Joe's Place At Joe's Place this week the menu was:

Scrambled eggs on toast, corned beef hash and baked beans, toasties with a variety of fillings, steamed puddings and cake with custard We served 38 scrambled eggs, 65 corned beef hash, 82 toasties and 58 desserts

We used 76 eggs, 17 tins of corned beef, 16 tins of potatoes, 19 tins of baked beans, 3 tins of ham, 2 tins of tuna, 80 cheese slices, 14 loaves of bread, 20 individual steamed puddings, 3 large cakes and 12 tins/packets of custard, as well as salad, milk, butter, oranges and bananas

We are always grateful for donations, especially of tins of mince and stewed steak, corned beef, ham, potatoes and custard. Cakes and wrapped biscuits are also appreciated.
